The Evangelism team (Eteam) was set up to share the Good News of Jesus Christ through thoughts, words, and deeds; including hospitality and service to the community. Some of the projects the E-team has initiated are Music on the Main, Rogation Sunday, and Letters to St. Dysmas (anonymous letters of encouragement to

those imprisoned individuals that have turned towards Christ and are now part of a Lutheran program). During COVID, the E-team members sent cards to every congregational member and friends of the church as an outreach to let them know our church family was thinking of them and praying for them. We tend to focus on inclusion and attracting new members. In the past, we have worked on developing, promoting and presenting seminars and guest speakersincluding a "Peace of Mind"

seminary on all things dealing with death, as well as the Native American Presentation.

We are looking for interested new members with some fresh ideas of ways to share the Good News to the community. We normally meet once a month (it was the third Tuesday evening of the month before COIVD, but we have been meeting by Zoom and occasionally in person since then).
